Agropalma took measures to prevent further invasions, at the same time as it sought its repossession through judicial channels but emphasized that it never used or allowed attitudes that implied physical violence against any person.</p> <p>The agreements established at the conciliation hearing, held on February 17, for the repossession of land, are being strictly complied with by Agropalma.
